Seventy-four Go North East employees have been honoured for reaching significant long service milestones achieved by very few people these days.

The employees all received special commendation awards for their 25, 30, 35, 40, 45 and 50 years' service at a recent celebration evening.

Bus drivers Michael Hendry, 67, and Keith Rutherford, 63, have each given 45 years' commitment to Go North East.
